

Overview

In Year 7 studies in Geography will inspire in students a curiosity and fascination about the world and its people that will remain with them for the rest of their lives.

Teaching equips students with knowledge about diverse places, people, resources and natural and human environments, together with an understanding of many of the Earth's key physical and human processes.

Term 1

Students begin the year with an investigation into weather and climate in the UK, this unit includes an exciting introduction to fieldwork on our own beautiful school site.

Next, students will engage with an indepth study of the amazing continent of Asia. We will investigate the region of the Arabian peninsular and the countries of China, Russia,

India and Japan, exploring the environmental regions and key physical and human characteristics.

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Term 3

The Summer term sees Year 7 students being introduced to the fascinating geographical processes of erosion and weathering. We will investigate weather and climate in the UK, and how erosion and glaciation have formed some of the amazing geographical features of our coast and rivers.



Term 2

In the Spring Term, students will explore the physical and human geography of The United Kingdom, building on their existing knowledge to develop a range of geographical skills including map work.

This unit includes human geography relating to population, urbanisation and economic activity in the primary, secondary, tertiary and quaternary sectors.
